collection of folk and fairy tales grouped together by tale type i.e. sleeping beauties, child hero, damsels in distress, etc. includes commentary on authors, editors and circumstances under which the stories developed

although readers and filmgoers are strongly familiar with Disney's sanitized child centric fairy tales, they are quick to catch on to reworkings of classic tales into a contemporary context. The rise of such retellings seems to indicate that readers are hungry for a new narrative one that hearkens back to the old yet moves the storyline forward to reflect conditions of the modern world. No mere escapist fantasies, the reimagined fairy tales of the late 20th and early 21st centuries reflect social, political and cultural truths. Sixteen essays consider fairy tales recreated through short stories, novels, poetry and the graphic novel from both best selling and lesser known writers, applying a variety of perspectives including postmodernism, psychoanalysis, Marxism, feminism, queer theory and gender studies. Along with the classic fairy tales, fiction from writers such as Neil Gaiman's *Stardust* and Gregory Maguire's *Wicked* is covered.

This bestselling anthology of folk and fairy tales brings together 54 stories, 9 critical articles and 24 color illustrations from a range of historical and geographic traditions. Sections group tales
